

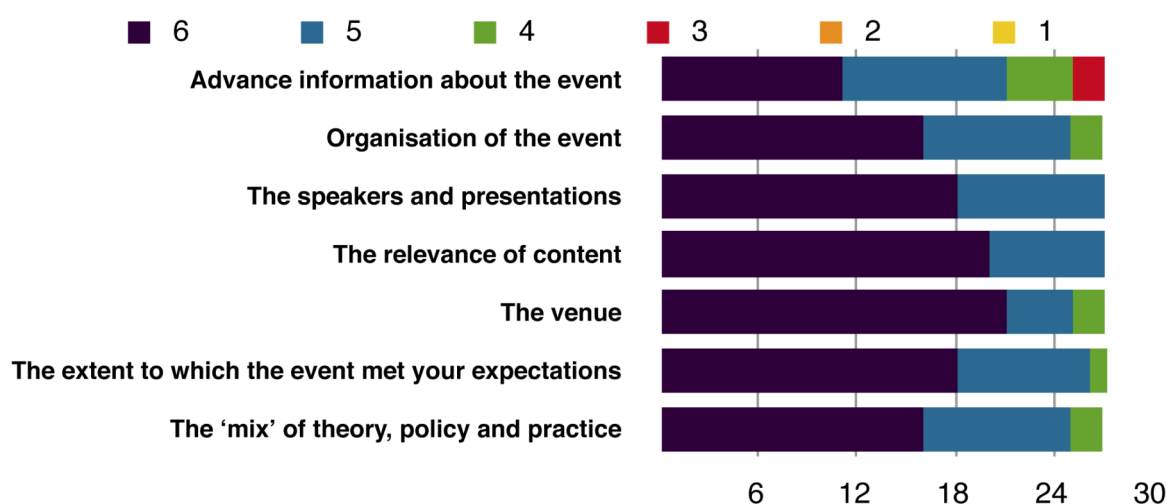
Recognising and Realising Children's Rights
